


Population Growth





Canada Leads G7 in Growth by Wide Margin; Growth Rebounds Back in 2021-2022


Annual population growth in Canada from 2002-2022

Components of Annual Population Growth in Canada, 2011 to 2021






Main Trends Shaping Growth since Census 2016

- Immigration started to rise around 2015, dropped during the pandemic and bounced back to an all-time high in 2021-2022
- Interprovincial migration to Alberta dropped with the downturn in the resource sector but started to increase in 2021-22
- Interprovincial migration to the Maritimes started to increase around 2015 with high increases in last two years
- In Ontario high immigration has been balanced against increasing out internal migration
- Population churn in the Toronto CMA with increasing out-migration since 2015



Two Streams of Immigration to Canada: Permanent and Non-Permanent


Components of Annual Immigration to Canada, 2011 to 2022





Over a Third of Recent Permanent Resident Immigrants Had Canadian Experience Before Getting Landed Status


Canadian experience pre-landing immigrant status, 2016-2021


Components of Annual Net Migration for Ontario, 2011 to 2022





Migration to the Maritime Provinces Picked Up Around 2015


Components of Annual Net Migration to the Maritime provinces, 2011 to 2022





Out Migration from Ontario Picked Up 2020-2022


Components of Annual Net Migration for Ontario, 2011 to 2021





Toronto CMA Experiences High Immigration but Also High Internal Out Migration


Components of Annual Migration to Toronto CMA, 2011 to 2022





Most Leaving the Toronto CMA go to Close-By CMAs; Some Move Beyond the Fringe of CMA


Destination CMA of out-migration from Toronto CMA, 2021-2022






Percent Population Growth 2021-2022





Mid-Sized CMAs Had Highest Growth in 2021-22


Annual Population Growth 2021-2022, Ten Fastest Growing Census Metropolitan Areas and other Large CMAs

Annual Percent Population Growth 2021-2022








2021 Census Percent Population Change 2016-2021 Canada - By Census Division

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



Highest Growth Projected to be at Oldest Ages


Projected population growth, Canada





The Older Population Accounts for an Increasing Share of Income and Expenditures


Share of total aggregate income of total population 1976-2020

Projected Population by Generation, Canada







Number and percent of population 2023-25 are targets






A Diversity of Immigrants by Category of Admission




Projected percent permanent and non-permanent residents, Canada






NewtoCanada Shows About a Third of Permanent and Temporary Immigrants to Canada Q3 2021-Q3 2022 Were From India

Immigrants Canada Q3 2021-Q3 2022












Over One in Four Canadians are Members of a Racialized Population Group

Number and percentage of population in racialized groups, Canada








Racialized Population Groups May Double to 20M by 2041

Projected total population of racialized population groups






Population in racialized groups as a percent of total population, 2021, Canada




The Pandemic Had a Major Impact on Census Collection on Reserves

- 787 Reserves or settlements enumerated in 2021
- 63 Reserves or settlements not enumerated in 2021
 - 14 Reserves not enumerated in 2016
 - 31 Reserves not enumerated in 2011
- Also, higher non-response rates on participating reserves and more generally in northern communities



Census Counted 1.7 Million Indigenous People but Estimated Population is 2.1 Million




Total Indigenous Identity Population 1,673,780


Indigenous Population, 2021 (thousands)





Increases in Level of Education; Women are Now More Highly Educated


Percent of persons with post-secondary degree or diploma, age 25-54, Canada

Total Employment Canada (Millions)





Slight Decline in Employment Rate of Older Men


Absolute change in employment rate January 2020 to January 2023





Exclusively Working from Home Slowly Declining and Close to One in Ten Reported Hybrid Work in December 2022


Proportion (%) of Non-Absent Workers 15-69 who usually work exclusively from home







Large Increase in After-Tax Income, Partly Due to Pandemic Payments

Annual Percentage Change





Wage Increases Have Not Kept Up With Inflation


12 Month CPI increase and average wage increase, Canada

Year over year change in average household disposable income and CPI







Savings Rate Continues to be Higher than in Pre-Pandemic Years


Index of income and expenditures, seasonally adjusted (Q1 2019 = 100)

Change in Expenditures (constant dollars) Q3 2019 to Q3 2022



Summary of Main Trends

- High Population Growth
 - Growth spreading out to mid-sized and smaller urban areas
 - All growth accounted for by immigrants and their children
- An Aging Population
 - o Particularly high growth for population 75 and older
- Continuing high permanent resident immigration; uncertainty about non-permanent residents
- An increasingly racially diverse population
- Uncertainty about income and wealth trends
